Two CPS 75th Anniversary Flags were delivered by USPS Chief Commander John Alter, SN and received by CPS Chief Commander Richard Bee, AP on May 5th at Windsor Yacht Club, where CPS has its beginnings in 1938, blessed by Fr. Stan Fraser and then sent on a journey: one West to Vancouver Island, BC and one East to St. John's, Nfld. Stopping in each CPS District and most Squadrons during their journey, the flags will return to the CPS Annual General Meeting in Toronto on October 26th where we will be culminating our 75th anniversary celebrations. One flag will be retained by CPS and the other will travel to the United States Power Squadrons (USPS) 100th anniversary celebration in January 2014 to symbolize the importance of the role that USPS had in our beginning and our growth... eventually coast to coast.

For the Quinte District celebration, the flag was carried to shore by Quinte District Secretary Gina Lee in the Dragon Boat, *The Noble Lady* along with members of the Peterborough Survivors Abreast and the Cobourg Survivor Thrivers.

Having a marine radio is the best thing to have, but *16 is something new.

Use of a marine radio is the most efficient method of alerting the Canadian Coast Guard, Quinte Search and Rescue and other boaters to an emergency situation.

And operators of vessels not equipped with a marine radio can use the *16 service to contact the nearest Marine Communications and Traffic Services (MCTS) Centre easily in case of an emergency.

Boaters keying *16 on their cell phone connects them directly to the officer on duty at MCTS.

Then the centre (MCTS) will arrange assistance for them by calling the Joint Rescue Coordination Centre (JRCC) at 8Wing/CFB Trenton and then dispatch the necessary assets," he said.

The Canadian Coast Guard, in co-operation with some cellular carriers, provides the marine emergency service for cell phone subscribers.

It is important for subscribers to determine if their cellular carrier offers this feature to its customers," stated the Canadian Coast Guard on the website. The *16 service is free to the cell phone subscribers and no air-time or long distance are charged. The use of the service is "normally" restricted to obtaining assistance or relaying information relating to distress and urgency situations.

Quinte Search and Rescue and Canadian Coast Guard Auxiliary are first responders on the water and if you're in trouble on the Bay of Quinte and don't have a marine radio in your vessel, dial *16.

The majority of the vessels that are out on the Bay of Quinte don't use marine radios."

FACT BOX:

*When using Canadian Coast Guard's *16 to report a marine distress situation, the following information should be provided by boaters, when available:*

- The location of the vessel
- Your cell phone number
- The nature of the emergency
- The name or identification of the vessel
- The number of persons on board
- Description of the vessel
- The type of assistance required
- The weather conditions at your location

Life Jacket Recovered From Bay of Quinte

An inflated personal flotation vest was recovered in the Bay of Quinte by local sailors near Trident Point, south of Shannonville and east of Massasauga Point Wednesday evening, but there was no indication to whom it belonged.

Rod Hutcheson, public relations officer with Quinte Search and Rescue Unit 507 of the Canadian Coast Guard Auxiliary (QSAR), said a QSAR crew was called by the Joint Rescue Coordination Centre at CFB Trenton at about 6:25 p.m. after the sailboat's occupants heading towards Belleville recovered the vest.

QSAR's main rescue vessel, the Bruce A Sutcliffe, was launched and commenced a search eastbound, from Trident Point to Telegraph Narrows, looking for someone in the water.

"QSAR was joined in the search by a search and rescue helicopter (CH-146 Griffon) from 424 Search and Rescue Squadron from (8 Wing) CFB Trenton," said Hutcheson.

Hutcheson noted the search continued until shortly after 9 p.m.

“Until darkness made it impossible to continue,” he said.

Neither the Sutcliffe, nor the SAR helicopter spotted any sign of someone in distress in the water.

“The recovered inflatable vest had no markings on it indicating to whom it belonged. It was however not a pfd (personal floatation device) certified for use in Canada,” added Hutcheson
