<u> Officer Reports – 2021-12-13</u>

Commander:

Here is my report for the last three weeks. In short: our boating courses are going well, preparations for and advertisement of the upcoming Seminar on Collision Regulations and Buoying Systems have progressed, the Gabriola Elementary School Principal discussed our Squadron's proposed programme for the older students with me, and I have had conversations with some Bridge Members about the PRO position and about the further development of the "Guide to Boaters' Services". The problems with the CPS-ECP National website continue. A little bit more detail:

EDUCATIONAL

B2&3 and B4 **blended courses** are proceeding normally. (I helped with one session of the B4 course). Agathe and Nigel are letting other Bridge members lead some of the review sessions and this is much appreciated by all.

Agathe and Sean have organized a free **seminar** on Wednesday December 15 at the basement of the Community Hall. Sean will be leading this seminar which will deal with Collision Regulations and Buoying Systems. Several Bridge members have helped advertising this seminar, and Jude and Elaine have offered to take some refreshments to the participants. COVID 19 restrictions (number of participants, distancing, masks, hand washing) will be adhered to during the seminar, (I will ensure that this actually happens)

Regarding the plan to provide some type of **boating education to the Gabriola Elementary School older children in May and June of 2022**, the school principal and I have recently talked over the phone. The principal is quite enthused about our plan. She would like for our Squadron to submit our detailed plans to her during March of 2022. I asked her whether she would like one of her staff to participate in our preparations prior to March, and she responded that it will be OK for our Squadron to work on a proposal on our own, and then submit our proposal to her. After our submission to her in March, she will take it up with her staff and will advise us.

PRO Position and preparation of a Boaters' Guide to Services

Further to our last Bridge Meeting, I have had conversations with some Bridge members about both the above subjects. It needs to be stressed that the PRO is not expected to perform the PRO's responsibilities alone and the same goes for the preparation (and later distribution) of the Boaters' Guide to Services. The PRO must be able to delegate where or when needed and know that he/she can count on Bridge members help. The members of the Communication Committee,

of which the PRO is a member do have regular contact with the PRO. Regarding the further work on the development of the "Boaters' Guide to Services", ideally one person will take the lead, but success will require and can only be achieved through the efforts of several people, not just the leader.
