EDUCATIONAL

Regarding the plan to provide some type of **boating education to the Gabriola children of ages 11 & 12 in May and June of 2022**. A Squadron Committee has done further work on this and will report to the Bridge on Monday January 4th. The committee includes Li Decosas, Nigel Wells and Agathe Gaulin. The idea so far is a series of four sessions that would lead to a PCOC. (Boating Certificate) for the students. More details later.
