## Commander:

### **EDUCATIONAL-PUBLIC RELATIONS (Sandwich Boards, Sounder, Microsite)**

#### **Preparatory Meetings for PCOC-ROC(M) Review Meetings-Youth Camp- Four seminars**

I participated in a couple of meetings that involved Agathe, Li, and also Nigel and John B. These meetings dealt with the defining and subsequent fine-tuning of 1) a programme of PCOC and ROC(M) review meetings in person, 2) a 2 day “Boating Camp” for youngsters (ages 9+) at the Community Hall, and 3) a four seminars programme on Wednesday evenings, also at the Community Hall. ### **With seasoned sailors and power boaters from Gabriola**

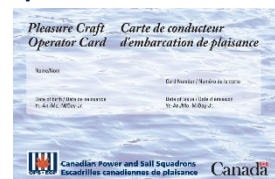

Ages: 9+ (separate groups for elementary school & teenagers)
