


Maritime Radio Course

Introduction to Marine Navigation—Boating 3 March 30-May 4th at Willy's Galley, Reed Point, Port Moody



Packing Food for a Month Cruise -- Part 1: The Ingredients ~Submitted by Cynthia Oldham



My family have been blessed to be able to cruise for about a month at a time on our 36 foot sailboat (the Pacific Swan) for the last two summers. The Swan has a large chest fridge with small freezer powered by 160 Watts of solar panels, which is handy. We cruise the inside passage and can therefore schedule a

partial resupply every week or two. Some of our favorite resupply points are: Lund, Port McNeill, Comox, Nanaimo, Sidney and Victoria.

When I plan the menu for the cruise I work with the following three constraints: we only expect to pick up bread, milk and eggs en route; going to restaurants is non-optimal when traveling with a 9, 5 and 1.5 year old; and we minimize re-packaging of food, as we are very busy just before leaving on a long trip. Therefore, most food is purchased and loaded directly from

cookies, sweet snacks, cheesie poofs

the store at the beginning of the trip. This article explains which foods can easily be purchased and will naturally store for a month under reasonable conditions (and how to keep them).


The key to successfully keeping food for a month is to find a naturally cooled "root cellar" in your boat. This is a compartment against the hull under the water line, therefore cooled by the water and insulated from warming by the boat above. In our boat there is one under the aft cabin bunk and under the floor boards in the galley. This is where we store: onions, tortillas, apples and red pointed peppers. (Last trip, red pointed peppers kept better than red/yellow bell peppers). I find that produce here keeps even better than in a fridge at home.

Major protein sources we use are canned chicken breast (from Costco), Yves ground round (a ground beef substitute), eggs (whole and egg whites), hot dogs, ham and cheese. {Keep an eye on the best before dates of the food when you purchase it.} Carbohydrates include tortillas, tortilla chips, pasta, rice, instant mashed potatoes (dried), and hashbrown potatoes (dried in waxed cardboard box). {Dried potatoes are from Costco.} Fruits and veggies include frozen mixed veggies, onions, red

pointed peppers, apples, canned fruit (in plastic cups). See the side box with a listing of the key ingredients in the Swan's pantry.

If you have any questions post them on the PMPSS Face-book page, and I will respond. That way everyone else who has the same question can read the answer as well. Next Quarterdeck, I will write about what breakfasts, lunches and 8 different dinners we make from those ingredients.

Salmon Cakes with Sriracha Lemon Aioli Recipe

Ingredients:

For the Salmon Cakes

- 2 pounds salmon fillet
- I I/2 teaspoon salt
- II/2 teaspoon pepper
- I large onion, diced, sautéed
- 2/3 cup plain dried breadcrumbs
- I/2 cup finely chopped fresh parsley
- 1/3 cup mayonnaise
- I/4 cup Dijon mustard
- I large egg (or 2 egg whites), lightly beaten
- 4 tablespoons of lemon juice

For the Sriracha Lemon Aioli

- 1/2 cup mayonnaise
- 4 teaspoons Sriracha sauce
- 4 teaspoons lemon juice
- I clove garlic, minced
- I/4 teaspoon salt



Preparation:

For The Salmon Cakes:

Preheat oven to 400. Rinse and pat dry the salmon, then place on a parchment-lined baking sheet and season with 1/2 teaspoon salt and pepper. Roast until cooked through, about 15 minutes. Allow to cool 5 minutes then using fork s flake or separate the salmon into small pieces.

Place salmon in a large bowl. Add onions, breadcrumbs, parsley, mayo, mustard, egg, & lemon juice. Season with I teaspoon salt and pepper, then mix gently.

Using your hands, form the mixture into patties and place on a parchment-lined baking sheet.

If you are freezing the salmon cakes, leave them on the baking sheet and place them in the freezer. Once firm, store them in a resealable freezer bag until needed.

To finish the cakes, bake on 400 for about 15-20 minutes, just until they start to crisp and become golden.

For The Sriracha Lemon Aioli:

Combine all ingredients in a small mixing bowl, and whisk thoroughly. Adjust salt and pepper to taste.
