### A Message From Jerry Powers

#### **Canadian Coast Guard Update:**

Coast Guard and Port Metro Vancouver are re-assessing the original plan to install sector lights on the Second Narrows Bridge to assist ships with nighttime transits. Following more discussion with pilots, it is now believed that lighted range markers may be a better option.

### **Trans-Mountain Expansion Project Update:**

The Westridge Marine Terminal is now 59% complete. Recent enhancements to the overall ship safety regime include the provision of tug escorts, both tethered and untethered, between Westridge Terminal and Buoy J (offshore of Neah Bay) and substantial additions to vessel and staff resources for West Coast Marine Response Corporation (WCMRC). These include 44 new vessels, 135 new employees, a time charter with KOTUG Canada for one large offshore support vessel (OSV) and the establishment of a mid-point tug support base at Beecher Bay.

#### **Puget Sound Harbour Safety Committee Update:**

The past year of the Covid pandemic has pointed out certain limitations of West Coast ports to deal with congestion caused by high numbers of container ships. Proposed remedies include the establishment of a North America wide system to accommodate ships approaching the West Coast as well as having those ships anchor in Asia before departing or slow steaming to North America.

#### **Connected Coast Project Update:**

With reference to my report to Council dated 6 December 2021, I can now advise you that Baylink Networks, the contractor selected to design and build the Connected Coast Project, has indicated that it now plans to alter the route into Alert Bay in order to keep the cables out of the bay. The route as initially planned would have added a substantial limitation to anchoring options in Alert Bay. The contractor has also indicated that applications for approval will be submitted to Transport Canada for proposed cable routes into Port Hardy, Port Neville, Refuge Cove, Granite Bay and Heriot Bay, all of which are subject to similar concerns over anchoring limitations.



## RADIO STATION LICENCE

Many boaters may not be aware that a *Radio Station Licence* is required to legally operate a VHF/DSC radio when travelling in the USA

The Radio Station Licence is NOT REQUIRED if the vessel is operating in Canadian waters

The Radio Station Licence will only be issued to radio equipment which meets the approval of \*ISEDC-SM

A label with a nine digit number on the back of the radio indicates this approval; equipment purchased in the United States may not have this approval number

When travelling in U.S. waters or waters of a country other than Canada, a *Radio Station Licence* and a \**Restricted Operator's Certificate (M)* are required to fully comply with International Law

A  $Restricted\ Operators\ Certificate\ (M)$  is a certificate required by radio operators on all recreational vessels boating in Canadian or USA

\*\*Innovation, Science and Economic Development Canada – Spectrum Management – is a Federal Government Department which sets out and controls the regulations and procedures established by the International Telecommunications Union

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### **Connected Coast Project**

This project is the result of a joint venture agreement between the Strathcona Regional District and CityWest, a Prince Rupert based internet provider. The project will bring new or improved high-speed internet accessibility to 139 rural and remote coastal communities, including 48 Indigenous communities. This will require over 3,000km of cable. Baylink Networks Inc has been hired to plan and install the cable with an expected completion date in 2023.

This is certainly a worthwhile project but the current plan involves laying cable through recognized and widely used anchorages without any signage to indicate the presence and location of cable on the sea floor. In the past, cables such as this avoided anchorage areas and approval from Transport Canada was required.

When Bill Wilson and I began looking at the project, we were alarmed by the following statements found in Baylink Networks documents.

- Transport Canada only has jurisdiction for sections within and connecting to port authorities.
- The project is a minor work under the class of Submarine Cables and the project can proceed without notifying Transport Canada.

We initially felt that these statements were inaccurate. We were wrong. After discussions with Baylink Networks and NPP staff it appears that these statements are accurate.

There is limited information on detailed design but here are few locations where we have cable routing information.

#### Heriot Bay



Note that the cables travel through an anchorage area and the circuitous route of the cable. There are no plans to provide signage indicating the presence and location of cable at any landing location. We have requested that the landing location be relocated to a point east of

the BC Ferries dock. No response at this time.

#### Port Neville




These cables will pass through a recognized anchorage area. We have requested that the landing location be moved 700m closer to Johnstone Strait but this has been denied by Baylink

#### Refuge Cove



We have recommended that the landing site be moved outside of the cove but Baylink has denied this request.

#### Alert Bay



The yellow marks indicate the location of AIS signals from vessels at anchor. These were all captured during the last 2 weeks of August. The 2 vessels right over the cable route are commercial tugs. We have requested that the landing site be moved to a location outside of the bay along with all cables but this has been denied by Baylink.
