





The Captain's Table

Grilled Tex-Mex Chicken with Spicy Peach and Plum Salsa

The sweetness of the peaches and plums beautifully contrasts with the spicy jalapeño in the salsa and the full-flavoured spicy chicken. If you like your food really fiery, stir an extra jalapeño into the salsa. The salsa is delicious with fish and pork as well! Or barbecue extra chicken, then slice and serve in tortilla wraps with grilled red peppers, onions, salsa and sour cream. Endless possibilities!

Spicy Peach and Plum Salsa:

- 2 Peaches
- 2 Plums
- 2 Small Plum Tomatoes, seeded
- 2 Green onions, thinly sliced
- I Jalapeno pepper, minced (optional)
- I Clove of Garlic, minced
- 2 Tbsp. Lime juice
- 1/4 Cup finely chopped mint or coriander

Salt to taste

Tex-Mex Chicken

I Tsp each dried oregano, chili powder and ground cumin (or to taste. We omit cumin to suit us)

1/2 Tsp salt

1/4 Tsp cinnamon

Pinch of Cayenne Pepper

4 boneless, skinless chicken breasts



Spicy Peach and Plum Salsa:


Peel peaches if desired; dice into 1/2-inch (1 cm) pieces and place in medium bowl. Dice plums and tomatoes into same size pieces as peaches. Stir in green onions, jalapeño pepper, garlic and lime juice. Stir in mint or coriander, and salt to taste. Set aside.

Tex-Mex Chicken:

In small bowl, stir together oregano, chili powder, cumin, salt, cinnamon and cayenne; sprinkle over and pat into both sides of chicken. Place on greased grill over medium heat; grill until chicken feels springy when touched and juices run clear when chicken is pierced, 5 to 6 minutes per side. Serve salsa spooned over chicken.

Restricted Operator Certificate (Maritime) & DSC





Beyond the PCOC: Boating 2



Sep 15 to Oct 20, Reed Point Marina, Willys Restaurant, Port Moody

Enjoyment and safety on the water require knowledge. Beyond the PCOC will take you to the next level in your boating education. Technology has changed the way we navigate. However, in order to use a GPS/chartplotter effectively, you should understand the use of paper charts and coastal navigation. The topics covered in this course; magnetic compass, global positioning and charts, navigation, conning, electronic navigation, anchoring, handling a boat under power, ropes lines and knots will increase your boating knowledge and make your adventures on the water safe and enjoyable.

This course also has a number of optional topics that will be taught depending on the needs of the students; these include tides and currents, canals and locks, towing, trailer-


ing, collision regulations and a check list for layup and launch.

The fee for a second family member is lower as they are expect to share some of the material. The course will run for 6 Thursday evenings from 7PM to 10PM, with the exam on the final evening. The companion course to this is "Introduction to Navigation". It is strongly recommended that you take this course as well to obtain the skills necessary to navigate using paper charts should the electronic systems fail.


Boat & Engine Maintenance

This course also has a number of optional topics that will be taught depending on the needs of the students; these include tides and currents, canals and locks, towing, trailering, collision regulations and a check list for layup and launch.



Others pass us, some stop including Goldmember who suggested we turn back and leave the dinghy back with Makwa, he would pick us up and take us to the cottage, but we motored on in our little dinghy. Boy N' Sea offered their hand held radio so we could keep in contact (and now we have one for the dinghy as well). On four separate occasions, either Boy N' Sea or Buddy Buoy checked in on us. We were well looked after and never forgotten on our slow trek.

Once at the cottage dock, many hands offered support to secure our dinghy and help us onto land. Lynn and Jack opened their cottage to everyone for a potluck Appy Hour and were such gracious hosts. Arrangements were made for Goldmember to zip us back while our dinghy was towed by another member. Tom took a while to stop smiling after that quick ride. Goldmember made several trips for members, offering the same quick return back to the raft up.

Monday was our return home. Again, everyone helped one another as the raft up broke away.

Being our first raft up, and only our second overnight trip on Makwa, we learned new things, most importantly, that members of PMPSS are all about safety, helping fellow members and having a good time.
