

Beyond the PCOC: Boating 2 & Introduction to Marine Navigation-Boating 3 September 21 - November 30/2017 - at Port Moody Secondary School \$275.00

Beyond the PCOC-Boating 2: More than your Boating Licence! The PCOC makes sure you have immediate navigation and safety skills but it's just the beginning of what you should know when you get on a boat. In the second of our Boating Series, you are introduced to the art of navigation, anchoring, ropes, lines and knots – not to mention what to expect when the boat is moving under power. This course also has a number of optional topics that will be taught depending on your interests; these include towing, trailering and a check list for layup and launch. Suggested Prerequisite: Pleasure Craft Operator Card (PCOC)

Introduction to Marine Navigation-Boating 3: Enjoyment and safety on the water require knowledge. Introduction to Navigation will take you to the next level in your boating education. Technology has changed the way we navigate. However, in order to use a GPS/chartplotter effectively, you should understand the use of paper charts and coastal navigation. The topics covered in this course; plotting and labelling on paper charts, environmental responsibilities, skippers responsibilities before setting out and when under way, electrical hazards and handling a boat under sail will increase your boating knowledge and make your adventures on the water safe and enjoyable.

Do you know what to do if a boat on fire calls you for help? Can you deal with emergencies on your own boat? It's not too late. We will still check your boat for free as well, and if you have everything you need, you'll get a Safety Inspection Sticker. This sticker won't guarantee that enforcement offic-

ers won't ask to see your safety equipment, but as long as you don't take anything off the boat that was there when

it was checked – you should be confident that you are in compliance and won't get a fine for safety equipment violations.

If you don't have everything... we will explain exactly what you should have on board so you can be sure to win that bet.

And once you are boating safely, you're not just saving \$200 - you could be saving your life.

The Captain's Table

Fattoush Salad with Shish Taouk (A light Lebanese meal—great for summer!



Fattoush (Lebanese "Crumbled Bread" Salad with Sumac and Pita Chips)

Makes 4 large main-dish salads or 6 small side salads.

Ingredients:

2 whole wheat pita pocket breads, cut into strips about 3/4 inch wide, then toasted and crumbled

2 heads Romaine lettuce, chopped

1/2 cup thinly sliced green onion

I cup diced tomatoes

I cup diced cucumber

1/2 cup coarsely chopped fresh mint leaves

1/2 cup coarsely chopped flat-leaf parsley (leaves only, no stems)

optional ingredients: chopped green pepper or radishes

Dressing Ingredients:

I tsp. chopped garlic (2-4 cloves garlic)

I tsp. salt (I used fine grind sea salt)

1/2 cup fresh squeezed lemon juice, about 2 large lemons (adjust the amount to your own taste)

I tsp. powdered Sumac, plus more for sprinkling on individual salads if desired)

1/2 cup extra virgin olive oil

Instructions:

Preheat oven or toaster oven to 400F/200C. While oven heats, mash together the chopped garlic and salt using a mortar and pestle, or the side of a knife or spoon. Put garlic-salt paste in a small bowl, then add lemon juice and I tsp. Sumac. Whisk in olive oil and set dressing aside. (You can also make the dressing in a glass jar and shake to combine.)

Cut whole wheat pita into strips about 3/4 inch wide and arrange on baking sheet. (Some recipes call for brushing the pita with olive oil, but I didn't do that.) Bake until pita strips are crisp but only barely starting to brown, less than 10 minutes. Watch carefully because they can go from crisp to overly brown rather quickly.

Remove outer leaves from Romaine, trim stem end, then wash and spin dry or dry with paper towels. Cut Romaine into fourths lengthwise, then turn and chop crosswise into small pieces. Put chopped Romaine into salad bowl large enough toss all ingredients.

Chop tomatoes, green onions, cucumbers, mint, and parsley and add to lettuce. Add about half of the dressing and toss, then add crumbled pita chops and toss again with more dressing. (You may not want all the dressing, but this salad should be quite wet.) At this point the salad should sit for a few minutes (or longer) to let flavors blend and so the pita chips absorb some of the dressing. To serve, arrange salad on individual plates and sprinkle with a bit more Sumac. You can also serve it in a large bowl with the Sumac sprinkled over.

Shish Taouk - Lebanese Chicken Skewers

Ingredients:

2 boneless skinless chicken breasts, cut into large cubes

1/4 cup Greek yogurt

3 tablespoons extra virgin olive oil

2 tablespoons tomato paste

6 cloves garlic, minced

I lemon, juiced

I tablespoon paprika

3/4 teaspoons dried thyme

1/2 teaspoon ground cumin

1/4 teaspoon ground allspice

I teaspoon salt

1/2 teaspoon ground pepper, or to taste

Bamboo skewers, soaked in water for at least 30 minutes.



Instructions:

In a small bowl, mix the minced garlic, yogurt, tomato paste, olive oil and lemon juice. Add in the dried spices, salt and pepper, and whisk together. Coat the chicken with the marinade and cover bowl. Refrigerate for at least 2 hours up to 8 hours. Any longer and you'll have mushy chicken because the acidity of the lemon juice and Greek yogurt will "cook" or break down the texture of the chicken.

Thread chicken on skewers and grill or cook under a broiler. Grill the chicken over moderately high to high, or broil for about 5-7 minutes per side, flipping once, until you see visible char marks and the chicken is cooked through.

Makes 2-3 servings.




