



Hello fellow squadron members, it's been a very busy first quarter for your Squadron Bridge members! Just some of the highlights include work on the upcoming AGM, Change of Watch (April 24th at Milestones Coquitlam) and Commander's Ball (Beach Theme! April 27th at the Old Mill Boathouse), Spring Tune Up (May 4th Reed Point Marina), Sailpast (May 5th, RPM to Bedwell Bay), Policy Committee updates to our operating procedures, and our Easter and Victoria Day cruises. Our upcoming St. Patrick's Day event will be at the Burrard Public House (March 17), our traditional Easter Cruise to Bowen Island (April 19-22) will include wine tasting among other activities, and the Victoria Day cruise will be our traditional cruise up Indian Arm! I also had the pleasure of attending our Student Grad event, deliver training in our Boating 2 course, and attending the kick off of free public seminars at Willy's Galley, the first being focused on Safe Anchoring. It was very successful, and Chuck Calnan delivered an entertaining and informative presentation. If you missed out, there will be more seminars announced and there are still seats open in our upcoming Electronic Marine Navigation (March 14th), VHF (March 25) and Boating 1/PCOC (April 8th).

RVCC (Recreational Vehicle Courtesy Checks) are a hot topic for us right now. Last year's Spring Tune Up event was very successful, and we aim to deliver a popular event again this year, but we were SO successful that we ran out of inspectors that could perform inspections during the event. As a result, we are reaching out to our membership to find volunteers to help out. Being an RVCC Inspector is both fun and educational in that inspectors get exposed to a wide variety of vessels, owners and safety practices, learn new tricks and recognize unsafe situations, and have the opportunity to meet and chat with members and other boaters at Reed Point Marina. Being an inspector is not difficult to learn as the Squadron provides both training (from Transport Canada) and mentoring, and this moves volunteers towards earning an annual merit mark. Please, consider giving a few hours of your time to help with this worthy effort by reaching out to RVCC@portmoodypss.com to join our upcoming training on March 30. In fact, I encourage anyone who wants to participate in helping to volunteer with any of our squadron's activities to reach out to us (you can reach out to me at Commander@portmoodypss.com), we're always looking to do more for our members, and many hands make light work!

We'd love to see you all come out and welcome the incoming Commander at our Sailpast event on May 5th. We'll be hosting breakfast for participants at Willy's Galley, welcoming new Squadron members, getting out on the water and performing the SailPast

After recently working with National to ensure our squadron's volunteers are recognized for their efforts, I'd like to share with you some very impressive numbers! It's clear we have committed volunteers who contribute deeply to our squadron's welfare.

21.8% of Squadron Members Volunteered in 2018 3075 Total Hours Volunteered in 2018 58 Merit Marks in 2018

Also, as compared to other squadrons in Canada, Port Moody volunteers contribute more than 10X more hours to the squadron than the national average, and it shows!

Should you be interested in the state of our National IT system, according to one of the director's, we have been told to expect an announcement for the deployment of the new IT system shortly. The key point for members to be aware of is that **members need to know their membership number and will need to register onto the new system** when it is launched. If you need assistance obtaining your membership number, please reach out to Jenn Doerksen at membership@portmoodypss.com and she can help you.

I'd like to ensure you are aware of upcoming changes from the Port of Vancouver. In December 2018 the Port proposed Amendments (https://is.gd/WDce2k) that include **speed limits in First Narrows, Coal Harbour, Indian Arm and Port Moody**, and **new reporting requirements** for tier 2 vessels (INCLUDING recreational vessels) that can carry >11 passengers to MCTS in respect to **transiting First or Second Narrows Control Zones** (TCZ-1, TCZ-2).

This is of course the Squadron's primary membership renewal period, and I encourage you to renew early! I also want to be sure you know about our great new referral program that gets you a free membership if you refer two new people to the Port Moody Squadron who elect to become members. We believe people often join and stay in the Squadron because of the friendships they make and the activities they participate in, and so we are encouraging you to share our social circle with friends. Let's bring more people to the party, and perhaps to help them have fun safely on the water too!

We need volunteers to inspect boats located at Reed Point on May 4th for the Spring Tune Up Event. Training is being offered by Transport Canada on March 30th, 2019 from 9am-Ipm at Reed Point (Marine Education Centre located next to the fuel dock). Please contact Steve DeWitt at RVCC@portmoodypss.com and let him know that you're interested in this training!

What can you expect to gain from the training and inspections? A deeper understanding of the required safety equipment is a personal gain but also an opportunity to see other boat operations/layouts, teach boat safety and interact with other boaters. RVCC Inspectors get to experience a variety of vessels and safety equipment, meet other squadron and marina members, and volunteering gets you merit marks!

Opportunities abound for volunteers in the Port Moody Power and Sail Squadron. We serve a large number of people, and are always looking for help, and even when we have enough people, we are looking to the future and considering how to provide capabilities in the future that need training today. Here are just a few of the key roles and skills we are hoping to find among our members;

Instructors and Proctors: We have an excellent team of Instructors and Proctors, but are always looking forward to being able to increase what we can offer people from a training perspective. We're also working on a series of evening or weekend seminars open to the public. Proctoring is an excellent opportunity to get exposed to the educational arm of our Squadron, for many it is very rewarding being able to help students and in fact learn much more about the subject at hand as Proctors than they may have as students. If you'd like to help out with the training side of things, we want to speak to you!

Graphic Artist: We have a significant need for volunteers with graphic arts capabilities who can work with both raster and vector image tools. Our needs include creation and editing of graphics content for our newsletter and web presence, content employed for marketing and events, and content employed by the squadron for its business functions. Being able to work comfortably in Photoshop and Illustrator or reasonable equivalents would be desirable for this role.

Web Related: Seeking volunteers interested in helping manage our technical infrastructure, build web site functions, administer our servers and email, and help design and develop our website. We are in an interesting period of change, being driven by the CPS National changes to their systems on which much of our content resides, and anticipate either new development on that platform or moving forward with our own plans for managing web content. If you have technical skills, talk to us!

Quarterdeck: We're always looking for people to contribute articles and content that benefit Squadron members, and publish this today in both the Quarterdeck newsletter as well as our private and public Facebook presence. Shortly we expect to be expanding this to our new content management system, so that our web site also contributes to distributing this content. We're also looking for people to assist with putting together the Quarterdeck newsletter, learn the tools used to build this publication, and help us improve our newsletter moving forward.

Volunteer Officer: Just as we have a Membership Officer who focuses on recruiting new members, ensuring existing members are satisfied and their needs are being met, and being a voice for members to the Bridge, PMPSS wants to have the same focus for volunteers. This is a role aimed at members who have already served on our bridge at some point so that they have experience with how Squadron operations take place, but this is also a new role, and will develop throughout this bridge year, the most important thing you can bring to the table is your values, focus on volunteer role satisfaction, and a passion for serving our membership. You will be working closely with the Commander and Executive Officer developing this new role.

Socials Assistants: This year we are taking on more social activities, and working to include more social elements into other Squadron events like our Recreational Vehicle Courtesy Checks and our annual Shoreline Cleanup. Frankly, our Socials people are GREAT, but more hands make light work, so if you enjoy planning social activities, let us know!

RVCC Inspectors: Our 2018 Cinco de Mayo event had the largest turnout we've ever had for our Recreational Vehicle Courtesy Checks, which of course was great! What wasn't so great was that we didn't have enough qualified inspectors to meet demand, and we were not able to get to everyone who wanted an inspection. Learning to be an RVCC inspector is not difficult, is very rewarding in terms of knowing you are helping keep people safe on the water, and provides a unique learning opportunity to see other vessels and how other vessel owners are doing things and solving problems. We provide both online training and mentorship with existing Inspectors, so if you have an interest, lets discuss it further!
