

The Captain's Table

Mushroom Asiago Chicken

This dish is a favourite in our house. If you don't have fresh thyme, try using 1/2 tsp dried in it's place. If you cannot find Asiago cheese, *finely grated* Romano or Parmesan is a decent substitute. If you like, you can switch the chicken with boneless pork chops and have a delicious meal! Serves 4.

Ingredients:

- 3 springs fresh thyme
- I ¹/₂ cups dry white wine
 ¹/₂ cup seasoned flour
- I lb boneless skinless chicken breast (about 2 large)
- 2 cups mushrooms, cut in half
- I clove garlic, minced
- 2 cup season
 2 tbs butter
- 2 tbs olive oil
- ½ cup heavy cream

- 1/4-1/2 cup shredded asiago cheese
- $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp salt (or to taste)

• ¹/₄ tsp pepper (or to taste) (Seasoned flour—1/2 cup flour, plus salt and pepper)



To Prepare:

- 1. Pound chicken breast with a meat mallet between 2 sheets of waxed paper or plastic wrap until meat is a uniform thickness; about ¹/₄-inch. Cut into serving-sized pieces (2 or 3 pieces per breast).
- 2. Heat the butter with *1* tbs of olive oil in deep, heavy skillet or saute pan over medium heat.
- 3. Dredge chicken in seasoned flour. Add to hot oil/butter in skillet. Saute until golden on each side, about 5 minutes per side. Remove from pan.
- 4. Add remaining olive oil to hot skillet. Saute mushrooms and garlic until mushrooms begin to brown.
- 5. Add white wine to skillet, scraping up all the browned bits that are at the bottom of the pan. Bruise the fresh thyme by twisting it between your fingers or hitting it with the dull side of a knife in a few places. Add thyme to mushroom/wine mixture in pan.
- 6. Add the chicken back to the pan. Bring to a boil, then reduce heat, cover and simmer for 15-20 minutes.
- 7. Remove chicken from pan. Add the cream and heat through. Add the asiago cheese (if you like it strongly flavored, use ½ cup; not as strongly flavored, use the ¼ cup-asiago is a powerful cheese and you can even use less for just a whisper of flavor. I like it strong so I used ½ cup).
- 8. Cook, stirring constantly over low heat until cheese melts. Continue cooking until sauce is reduced by about ½. If you wish to skip the reduction step, you may thicken the sauce slightly with about 1 tbs instant flour or 1 tbs cornstarch mixed with 2 tbs water...however, the reduction will taste better.
- 9. Add chicken back to pan and heat through.
- 10. Garnish with sprigs of fresh thyme. May be served over any pasta. We used spiralized zucchini as our pasta as shown in the photo. Enjoy!

PMPSS Members and The Shoreline Cleanup



The Shoreline Cleanup event on September 17th was successful, as the shoreline for 1.3km starting from Rocky Point Park was stripped of garbage. Socials (Melissa Forbister and Shelly Herron) also came up with a Scavenger Hunt that tied into the collection, and, while no team was actually able to complete 100% of the challenge, Team Tony won by completing the most scavenger challenges! The detailed response for this event was submitted to the Great Canadian Shoreline Cleanup but some of the highlights are as follows;

51Kg (112.2lbs) of garbage was collected including 183 Cigarette Butts, 109 pieces of plastic, 55 pieces of broken glass and 29 pieces of foam. Unique items included a perfectly usable Danforth anchor and chain, shotgun shells, and a large dock structure (shown in picture below). Thanks to the volunteers who came out despite the soggy weather!




Member News

Introduction to Navigation: Boating 3 Nov 3 to Dec 8,

Reed Point Marina, Willys Restaurant, Port Moody

Enjoyment and safety on the water require knowledge. Introduction to Navigation will take you to the next level in your boating education. Technology has changed the way we navigate. However, in order to use a GPS/chartplotter effectively, you should understand the use of paper charts and coastal navigation. The topics covered in this course; plotting and labelling on paper charts, environmental responsibilities, skippers responsibilities before setting out and when under way, electrical hazards and handling a boat under sail will increase your boating knowledge and make your ad-

ventures on the water enjoyable and safe.

This course also has a number of optional topics that will be taught depending on the needs of the students; these include tides and currents, canals and locks, towing, trailering, collision regulations and a check list for layup and launch.




