

Re: Government & Industry Liaison Report

Canadian Hydrographic Service (CHS) Update:

- New edition Chart 3534 (Plans – Howe Sound) just released.
- New edition Chart 3540
 (Approaches to Campbell River) release scheduled for January 2016.



- 3447 Nanaimo Hbr. / Departure Bay Cruise Ship Terminal (Dec. '15)
- 3475 Chemainus / Harmac / Osborne Bay (Dec. '15)
- 3479 Approaches to Sidney / Van Isle Marina (Dec. '15)
- 3538 Lund / Desolation Sound / Sutil Channel (no date scheduled)

CHS is planning to conduct surveys on Cultus Lake in 2016.

CHS is also initiating a study to determine the future of paper charts.

Completion is scheduled for March 31, 2016; public input



will be sought. Need for the review has been brought about by declining revenues, fewer resources and higher production costs.

Canadian Coast Guard (CCG) Update:

- CCG has reported that SAR incidents are up by 10% this year. No trend analysis has been done to date.
- The new Cape Mudge Sector Light is now finally in service. CCG is inviting comments on its effectiveness.

Recreational Boating Advisory Council (RBAC) Update:

- RCMP are currently seeking direction from Transport Canada for procedures to deal with derelict boats being moved (ie. underway) from anchorage to anchorage. Many of these vessels are unsafe and in most cases, noncompliant. RCMP are reluctant to take them in tow as that would require an assumption of responsibility and efforts at enforcement only shifts the problems to other areas.
- RCMP are also focusing attention on liveaboard vessels which are not necessarily derelict but on the verge of being unseaworthy.
- Commercial prawn and crab traps are becoming a serious navigation hazard as many are being rigged with marker buoys that rest just below the surface. Problems with these traps have been experienced in the Ganges, Sooke and Port Renfrew areas.
 Department of Fisheries has been requested to look into the matter.





Galley Grits Crispy Cod





X Thile it's hard to beat battered fish, deep frying is not the most practical of cooking methods to use in a boat galley. The next best thing? A pan-seared crispy potato chip like coating. It's quick, gluten free and you can totally customize the seasonings to your suit your tastebuds. The coating can be premixed at home and is convenient to store on board to use throughout the boating season, or prepare a batch of uncooked pre-coated pieces to freeze at home, to take boat to cook up at a later date...either way, quick and easy. Enjoy crispy fillets whole as part of a balanced meal with rice or French fries, and a green vegetable or salad, or cut up into bite size morsels to share at a potluck. Move over Crusty Crab and make room for Crispy Cod!



Crispy Potato Coated Cod

Ingredients (serves 2)

- .200 kg Cod or any white fish
- 2 tbsp Olive oil
- 1/2 c Potato crust mix
- 1 Egg
- 1 tbsp Milk
- Tarter Sauce

Instructions

- 1. Heat olive oil in non-stick pan to medium.
- 2. Mix together egg & milk
- 3. Dip fish in egg/milk mixture
- 4. Dip wetted fish into potato flake mix and coat thoroughly (can be flash frozen at this point)
- 5. Pan fry each side approx 2-3 mins for thin fillets, or 4-5+ for thicker (thaw from frozen before cooking)

Optionally can be baked in the SeaBQ set to high, using a nonstick pan and spraying pieces with a light coat of olive oil approx 10-15mins.

Remove to plate and serve with tarter sauce and accompaniments.



Coating for approx 12 single fillet servings

- 3 cups dried potato flakes
- 1 tsp Salt
- 1 tsp Pepper
- 2 tbsp Garlic powder
- 1 tbsp Onion powder

Add seasonings of your choice such as dill, lemon zest, mustard, chives, cheese and/or parsley.

Mix together in air tight storage container. Good for 6 mons kept optimally dry, dark & cool.
