





SAFETY ON THE WATER

The recent high-profile boating incidents have made the public more aware that there are some issues with alcohol and boating in this country.

The members of the VPD Marine Unit are taking a pro-active approach to this problem; we are not only attending to investigate as many reports of impaired boaters in our waters as we can but we have now undertaken the task of raising the issue with the Provincial Government.

You may or may not know that the province of Ontario has laws in place (using the Highway Traffic Act) that allow police to suspend the vehicle driver's licenses of impaired boaters who provide breath samples over 0.05mg%.

Specifically, "Boaters caught drinking and boating in Ontario will face the same penalties as those for drinking and driving..."

It is our belief that we need this type of effective legislation here in British Columbia. There are no provisions in the Canada Shipping Act 2001 to suspend an operators PCOC for impaired operation.

This is where your help is needed.

If any of you believe that allowing police to suspend vehicle drivers licenses of impaired boaters will help alleviate the problems that we all have to deal with on the water, please take some time to type out a quick letter outlining your reasons and any examples that you may have.

The letter can be addressed to Vancouver Police Deputy Chief Doug Lepard, in charge of Operations Division, Regarding: Suspension of Driving Privileges for Impaired Boaters

PLEASE SEND THEM TO THE MARINE UNIT because we are compiling the business case which will be given to the Deputy upon completion.

It is Deputy Lepard that has taken on the task of championing this cause with the politicians.

It is his belief (and all of ours) that this type of request for updating the British Columbia Motor Vehicle Act will be a success and help all of us ensure that we are doing everything we can to keep the boating public safe while they are enjoying our waterways.

As always, thank you all for the time this will take, for your continued passion and for taking ownership of our marine community.
